Work together to provide the best services in most cost effective manner




Our Population:



ENGINEERING AND PUBLIC WORKS

Roads – Bridges - Water – Wastewater – Recycling – Garbage -Environmental - Engineering

Highlights:

District Road Network Maintenance	We don't own a single street snow plow!
Water and Wastewater	18 plants in Muskoka (60,000 pop.) vs. 2 plants for all of Windsor (220,000 pop.)
Waste Management and Recycling	1 Landfill, 8 Transfer Stations, 3 Waste Depots + 90 Remote Bins sites



Cost Saving & Collaboration:

- Winter road
 maintenance
- Coordinated schedule of infrastructure maintenance and construction where possible

- Shared construction re: Bracebridge fire and ambulance station



SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHALLENGES

• Poverty, Employment/Income & Housing:

12% of residents are living in poverty

20% of residents have not completed high school or beyond, ages 25-64 years

Average employment income in Muskoka is 17% lower than the Province Muskoka: \$50,675 Ontario: \$61,496

In 2011 5,685 households were spending more than 30% of total income on shelter costs

Stats were derived from StatsCan Census 2011, Census 2016, 2011 National Household Survey, and Muskoka Community Services.



SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHALLENGES

• Barriers to Youth and Aging Population:

Muskoka youth unemployment was 14% 2014, which was about twice the rate for the general population

Youth face particular challenges representing significant percentage of Ontario Works recipients

43.5% of Muskoka residents are over the age of 55, including 25.6% over the age of 65.




