I would encourage Council to look at further development in Baysville due to the water and sewer infrastructure and encourage green industry in all parts of Lake of Bays. A special mention would be our Lake of Bays fire department, it is essential that council maintain a good working relationship with these men and women.

I support this because I believe the libraries are the centres of our communities and have become our cultural and local information centres. Since both branches have seen significant increases in their expanded programmes and membership over the last 5 years, it seems reasonable the funding level should increase to match this enhancement. I would support the Township exploring options to fund the Dwight Library expansion.

Robert Lacroix		
The areas I believe have too little spending are the Health Hub, Libraries, reserves and roads. My reasoning for the Health Hub is that it is a vital asset for our communities and to ensure its success, the Township needs to recognize the shortfalls given by the Province. The Libraries in both communities have seen significant increases in usage over the last several years. They are the hubs of our communities and I believe strongly that they need to be recognized as such and supported with appropriate funding. When I was first elected to Council, our reserves were non existent. Since then the reserves have had modest increases which need to be enhanced in order to prepare properly for the future. In the past council has had to borrow money to repair our road system, this should never happen. Our roads are the most expensive asset the Township owns. In order to maintain them we need to not only budget for road repair and maintenance but to enhance our ditching and brushing.
